

Application Process: -

Applicants are required to complete an application form. This application includes a "personal statement" which allows the applicant identify why they wish to do the course, what they hope to contribute, what they hope to gain, etc. Applicants are required to attend an interview with members of the Course Committee.

Cost: - €2,200.00, plus €25 administration charge.



- Approaches to Treatment and Rehabilitation
- Motivational Interviewing
- Professional Work Practice
- Community Research Methods

How it is structured?

The Diploma Course will be delivered one day a week on Tuesdays (10am-5pm), plus two Saturdays (10am-5pm) and two Thursdays (6:30pm-9:30pm) each month. It is a one year course, and runs from August to May.



Admission Requirements:

The Diploma is designed to provide a progression route for those who have already completed the Community Addiction Studies Course® or equivalent. Participants must have the capacity to complete a course at NUI Diploma Level 7, however this capacity is understood in the light of the principles of Adult Education. Participants must be over the age of 21, and must be available to attend the Course sessions as outlined above.
